Over the summer, all students entering seventh grade are required to read **Dark Life** by Kat Falls. Answers should be typed and printed and brought to class on the first day of school.

The summer reading book is available for purchase at Barnes & Noble, and it can also be found on www.amazon.com. Electronic books will also work for this assignment, as long as students bring their electronic readers to school. Students may listen to the novel on an audiobook while reading along. All students should bring their novels or electronic books on the first day of school, when we will begin corresponding activities.

In addition to the required summer reading book, we also recommend that students read regularly during the summer. The last question will require you to use a direct quote (text-lift) from the novel. Each answer should be at least one paragraph (6-8 sentences) long, but your answer may be longer. Please **type** your answers in MLA format.

7th Grade Summer Reading Questions

- 1. A dynamic character is a character who changes and grows over the course of the novel. How is the main character in the book a dynamic character? Provide specific examples and character traits from both the beginning and end of the novel in your response.
- 2. Describe the main conflict in the novel, and how it is resolved in the end.
- 3. The theme of the story is the lesson or message the author wants the reader to take away from the novel. **What is the theme of the novel?** Form a claim and explain your answer using specific evidence (including at least one direct quote) from the novel.
