

What are the hours for the Community Peer class?

There is both a morning class and an afternoon class. The times are as follows:

- AM Class, 8:30 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.
- PM Class, 12:00 p.m. – 2:30 p.m.

What are the costs?

Tuition will be \$3,083.00 for the 2019-2020 school year.

- Parents/Guardians provide transportation for their child as community peers do not receive bus transportation to/from the school.



How will I know if my child could benefit from the EC Community Peer Program with District 103?

Community peers have age appropriate social and language skills as determined by the Ages and Stages-3 Parent Questionnaire. An observation during an EC classroom visit would also be required.

What is the Early Childhood Community Peer Program at District 103?

It is a blended Pre-K program for 3 and 4-year-old children who live in School District 103.

The program is tuition-based and offered 5 days a week with a morning class and an afternoon class at Laura B. Sprague School in Lincolnshire.

What are the main characteristics of the EC Community Peer Program?

Our program provides a blended classroom setting that involves both general education and special education students. Other characteristics include: small classroom size, certified teachers with Masters Degrees in Early Childhood Education, strong team of specialists to support classroom, and developmentally appropriate curriculum:

- Literacy
- Math
- Social-Emotional
- Science
- Writing

What are the Benefits?

- Build familiarity with Laura B. Sprague School prior to Kindergarten
- Participate in “specials” (Library and PE) taught by Sprague staff
- Participate in “centers” instructed by support personnel (speech/language specialists, occupational therapists, social workers)
- Attend developmentally appropriate school assemblies and events
- Informally interact with Kindergarten teachers and classrooms
